


THE AREA OF ELY CENTRE FOR OSTROBOTHNIA Employment Bulletin

August 2020

The unemployment increased also in August in the area of ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia as a result of coronavirus



A total of 10 670 unemployed jobseekers were registered in the area of ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia at the end of August. This is 3 659 more than the previous year, but 2 678 less than the previous month. The big increase in the employment numbers can be explained with the effects of coronavirus and the measures that have been taken to prevent its spread. These measures have influenced the companies in the area. The share of the unemployed jobseekers out of the labour force in the area of ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia is the second lowest (9,2 %) in the mainland Finland. In the whole country the respective share out of the labour force is 12,5 %.

Compared with July the unemployment rate decreased by 2,3 % in the area of ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia and decreased by 2,2 % in the whole country. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

Trends:


- The unemployment in the area of ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia increased as a result of the coronavirus: the amount of unemployed was in August 3 659 more (+ 52,2 %) than the previous year.
- The effects of the coronavirus can be especially seen in the amount of the people that were laid off. In the end of August, the amount of fulltime laid-off was 2 611 i.e. 2 330 more than the previous year (+ 829,2 %).
- Also, the youth unemployment rate increased. The amount of unemployed people under 25 years was 444 more compared with the year before (+ 46,1 %).
- The amount of long-term unemployed increased by 438 persons compared with the year before (+ 26,2 %).
- The number of new open vacancies in August was 188 less than the previous year.
- The number of people in employment-promoting services is decreasing. In the end of August the amount of participants in services was in total 4 109 persons.





${\bf UNEMPLOYED\ JOBSEEKERS,\ MONTH\ BY\ MONTH\ COMPARISON}$








Unemployed jobseekers by sub-regional unit






Unemployed jobseekers by gender and age-group



Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
