


THE AREA OF ELY CENTRE FOR OSTROBOTHNIA Employment Bulletin

April 2022

The unemployment rate continues to decrease in the area of ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia





A total of 6 329 unemployed jobseekers were registered in the area of ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia at the end of April. This is 2 226 less than the previous year. The amount of unemployed was in April 232 less than the previous month.

The share of the unemployed jobseekers out of the labour force in the area of ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia is the lowest (5,6 %) in the Mainland Finland. In the whole country the respective share out of the labour force is 9,1 %. Compared with March the unemployment rate decreased by 0,2 % in the area of ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia and by 0,4 % in the whole country. The figures are from the Employment Service Statistics of the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment.

Trends:


- The amount of unemployed in the area of ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia was in the end of April 6 329 and 2 226 less (-26,0 %) than the previous year.
- The amount of fulltime laid-off was 606 i.e. 723 less (-54,4 %) than the previous year.
- Also, the amount of young unemployed people decreased compared with the situation the year before.
 The amount of unemployed people under 25 years was 410 less (-38,5 %) compared with the year before.
- The amount of long-term unemployed decreased by 558 persons (-21,6 %) compared with the year before.
- The number of new open vacancies in April was 645 more (+ 22,7 %) than the previous year.
- The number of people in employment-promoting services decreased compared with the year before. In the end of April the amount of participants in services was in total 4 531 persons.





UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS, MONTH BY MONTH COMPARISON








Unemployed jobseekers by sub-regional unit





UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS BY AGE GROUP Ostrobothnia









Unemployed jobseekers by levels of education and occupational group


UNEMPLOYED JOBSEEKERS BY LEVEL OF EDUCATION





Information about the website

On this website you will find the latest statistics from ELY Centre for Ostrobothnia's monthly Employment Bulletin. You can access a .pdf version of the current and previous months' Employment Bulletin by following the link on the right. The Employment Bulletin is based on the data from the MEAE's Employment Service Statistics. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment compiles statistics on the clients of the Employment and economic development offices (TE offices), including registered job-seekers, labour market policy services, and job vacancies reported to TE offices by employers. The data is collected from the customer service registry (URA) used by the TE offices. This means that the data used by MEAE Employment Service Statistics is completely registry-based. The statistical data covers all persons, services, and open vacancies in the aforementioned groups, as separately defined in the registry by the classifications and variables for the statistical period in question.

Owing to seasonal variations, the Employment Bulletin always includes a comparison with the corresponding month in the previous year. The descriptors used in the Bulletin are also available in a table format. The Employment Bulletins are published at the end of the subsequent calendar month. The official date of publication is announced in advance.
